Knowledge for Change (K4C): An Global Consortium for Training in Community Based Research

INTRODUCTION

K4C consortium is a global initiative, aimed at building capacities of the next generation of researchers in Community Based Participatory Research (CBPR).

Community Based Participatory Research (CBPR) is a collaborative approach which involves all the stake holder in research process establishing the research question, development of tools, collection of information analysis & dissemination of knowledge. The basic component of CBPR is Community. It is participatory & action oriented. It means community is source of knowledge and aims at conation of knowledge.

PRIA is the lead in CBPR research and Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University is one of the 3 universities recognized as CBPR Hub, by UNESCO Co-Chairs in CBPR. The university is a centre of partnerships between a higher education institution and a civil society organisation. (community)

Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University as Hub of CBPR focuses on the UN theme of Sustainable Development Goal 5 (SDG5). The university in this regard has taken initiative to start a Certificate Course in Community Based Participatory Research (CBPR) Certificate Course in session 2018-19.

About the UNESCO Chair

Established in 2012, the UNESCO Chair grows out of and supports the UNESCO global lead to play a 'key role in assisting countries to build knowledge societies.' The chair is co-located at the University of Victoria (UVic), Canada and at Participatory Research in Asia (PRIA) located in New Delhi, India. K4C is a global consortium made up of training hubs led by teams of civil society organizations and higher education institutions to provide projects and to co-create knowledge through collective action. It aims to build strong global partnerships with shared goals, joint responsibility and a solid plan for building research capacity to address local UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The initiative reinforces UNESCO Chair's global leadership in the field of participatory approaches to research and community –university engagement. The K4C Consortium is therefore conceptualised to foster innovative models of research that will offer a variety of means to enhance individual & institutional research training capacities and support the transition of settings.

K4C Hub at Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University, Raipur, Chhattisgarh

Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University (PRSU), Raipur is the Community Based Participatory Research (CBPR) Hub under tripartite agreement signed between the State Planning Commission, Raipur, PRIA and Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University, Raipur. This tripartite partnership functioned as one among the global hubs described above. The K4c consortium was designed to respond to contemporary societal challenges through an international partnered training initiative focused on the development of research capacities for the cocreation of knowledge through collective action by community and academics on issues related to the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The focus of the Hub that had been created through this partnership are:

- The co-construction of knowledge and its application to the solution of community issues, linked to at least three of the UN SDGs (indigenous development, water governance, poverty and inequality, climate action, gender equality and violence against women).
- Contribute to strengthening the trainees' employment and career opportunities
- Enhance institutional capacity in CBR at Higher Education institutions (HEIs) and Civil Society Organisations (CSOs).
- Generate contextually and culturally relevant learning materials in local languages, which will be accessible to students, academic researchers, activist, citizens, civil society organisations and the general public.

Activities of the Hub

1. Certificate Course In: Community Based Participatory Research

Certificate Course on Community Based Participatory Research (CBPR) focuses on generation of trained human resources to work in connection to Higher Education institutions (HEIs) and Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) in scientific manner and co create knowledge base on CBPR.

The learning focus of the course will be on the co-construction of knowledge and its application to the solution of community issues linked to the UN SDGs, in particular the SDG5 of gender equality and violence against women.

This course will generate contextually and culturally relevant learning materials and resources in local languages, which will be accessible to students, academic researchers, activist, citizens, civil society organisations and the general public.

Additionally, the course will:

- Make quality higher education accessible to all sections of society, including the tribal population of Chhattisgarh.
- Develop human resource with world class competence and skills in the respective disciplines.
- Develop master trainers as well as to train researchers in the field of CBPR.

The total number of enrolled students for the current CBPR certificate course is 21. The trained mentors are teaching and supervising certificate course on Community Based Participatory Research.

The following titles were included for the project work which included an extensive field work along with the submission. The field work report and finally sharing of the report with the community was also given priority.

- Sexual Harassment & its awareness at work place among sports women.

2. Mentors Training Program


Three mentors from Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University, Raipur have already completed 21 weeks Mentor Training Program (MTP), including 2 weeks face to face component in 2 phases of the programme. The face to face programmes were conducted at PRIA New Delhi and at the University of Victoria, British Columbia, Canada. The trained mentors are teaching and supervising certificate course. The centre has also conducted workshops to

develop research capacities of students for co creation of knowledge through collective action of community and academics. The students of the certificate course will undertake field studies in the community. The following Hub mentors have been trained:



One Day Workshop on "Women safety in the light of Kathua and Unnao rape cases" Date-19th April 2018

A participatory discussion on "Women safety in the light of Kathua and Unnao rape cases" was organized on 19th April 2018 in the seminar hall of Arts block, Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University, Raipur (C.G.). The program organized under the aegis of the Centre for Women's Studies, PRIA and Martha Farrell Foundation, was intended to provide a platform for students and faculty members to enable open discussion on the increasing frequency of horrifying rapes in the country. Total 90 students participated 17 students expressed their opinion through painting ,15 students wrote poem on the spot and others participated in discussion.

The outcome of the program was in the form of following reactions of the students, about the heinous offence.

- 1. Exemplary punishment.
- 2. People who support such case should be punished.
- 3. Social networking acts as insulation factor in the crime, as well as sensitization of the masses about gender equality.
- 4. Awareness building amongst girls & boys.
- 5. Self defence course for girls.
- 6. Educating girls and boys regarding sexual harassment.
- 7. Educating about how to report the incidents.
- 8. Attitude change & safe environment.
- 9. Awareness programmes to be conducted.

A workshop on Participatory Safety Audit (PSA) was organized by PRIA and Martha Farrell Foundation in community based participatory hub (Centre for Women's Studies), Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University, Raipur conducted a workshop participatory safety audit (PSA). The students were trained in mapping technique as research tool to collect information. The student used mapping technique to locate unsafe areas in the university campus. Total no. of participants from Youth Core Group were 40 (22 male and 18 female).



Recommendation received from the institutions/stakeholders:

- It is very important for an institution to provide safe and secured environment to students inside the campus. So, we will request VC and Registrar to:
- ❖ To have continuous Police patrolling at night
- ❖ Install C.C.T.V. cameras in and around the campus to increase the security
- Increase the number of guards
- ❖ Install street lights everywhere in the campus
- Not to allow anyone from outside to enter the campus after the university closes
- Close/block the road that goes towards the Pond
- Students also have to take some responsibility to stop the evil doings. The students that create such environment are from between them.

In film appreciation tool kit students were shown film clips related with sexual harassment and were asked their opinion on those scenes, the students were also asked what they would have done in that situation. Through the use of film cuts in Hindi, as well as through activities, and discussions, this toolkit has been used to generating a discussion on gendered social norms and on sexual harassment in workplace.

This tool was used as, young people easily recognise and to be able to identify the stereotypes and gender norms, both positive and negative, that are consciously and subconsciously promoted through popular media, and therefore, be able to evaluate the impact of this exposure in their own lives.
