### **Short Term Course in Intellectual Property Right**

(27.01.2022 - 29.01.2022)

Short term course on "Current issues and opportunities of IPR in higher education" was organized by Human Resource Development Centre, in association with Intellectual Property Right Cell and University Institute of Pharmacy of Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University, Raipur, C.G. from 27<sup>th</sup>-29<sup>th</sup>January 2022. The primary focus of Intellectual Property Rights and its Policy is towards promoting innovation and creativity in higher education in the university and its affiliated institutions. University have taken theinitiative approach regarding intellectual property that all inventions, patentable products, or copyrightable materials are subject to university policy, which typically gives the university first claim to the right of ownership and fund after commercialization. The Course was thought meticulously about national contribution in filling of patent from academic institution. The pool of resource person was designed in such a way that the participants get exposure from national to international patenting procedures, interaction with controller of patent office, industry consultant, Patent attorney from different regional offices of the country and experienced academician dealing with the intellectual property rights in the institute. 

# Title of presentation: Intellectual Property Right's Issues in Selecting Research Problems

In the session he postulated about the Intellectual property rights and patents in research. He cleared the concept of the researchers and participants on how to design research so that further findings could be patented in future. He stressed on the need of patent search before finalizing the research project to avoid duplication and plagiarism. He motivated researchers and participants to innovate things. He gave various examples showing that for invention there is no requirement of PhD or a degree in science it could be done by any person of any age. Mere discovery of existing things in new form or repurposing of drugs/ chemicals or presenting it in a different form could be patentable. But the important point to be noted is the invention should be novel, non-obvious and should have commercial applicability. He gave complete overview to the participants staring from objectives, terminology, the steps of procedure of applying patent, fees structure, time duration for each step, provisional specification, complete specification, significance of writing claims, replying examination reports etc. so that one could have knowledge how to apply patent. Discussion was also done on copyright, plant breeders rights, trade secrets etc. All the aspects of different Intellectual Property Rights were discussed. The session was followed by the interactive questionnaire and discussion in which various doubts of the participants were cleared. Session was highly beneficial for all the participants in Academics and Research specially related to IPR issues in selecting research problems.



# Title of presentation: Role of Intellectual Property Rights in Academic R & D for Entrepreneurship

The presentation was started with the quote "Education disseminates known knowledge. research converts money into knowledge, innovation converts knowledge into money". With these words he emphasized on the significance of innovation and taking of patents. He discussed the role of Academic leaders in innovation and value creation. In the Academic institutes there is requirement of new and varied leadership roles, proactive leaders are required to motivate their staff and students to go for patenting before publication. He gave various examples related to the significance of research leading to patenting and commercialization. Discussed global innovation Index 2021 of WIPO to explain India's successful leap in Innovation. We will have to create vision of innovation amongst our faculty members and students. 
# Title of presentation: Ip commercialization: Case study of universities innovation(Mind to market & lab to land)

### Title of presentation: "Patent Drafting and filling issues in Indian Context"




