The resolution of conflicts arising due to violation of human rights, racial and ethnic discrimination in the light of Gandhian philosophy was also contemplated on the floor of the house. Earlier in the day eight participants expressed their views in the elocution on the topic "Status of South Asian Universities in Global Ranking System". Participants emphasized on the further strengthening of the research collaborations to move up in the global ranking.




