

MASTER OF EDUCATION (CORRESPONDENCE COURSE) M.ED. (CC)

(This course will be of two years duration)

1/ Any graduate of a recognised University who has been admitted to the degree of Bachelor of Education in Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University, or to a degree recognised as equivalent thereto, for the purpose of this Ordinance may offer himself as a candidate for the examination of the - Degree of Master of Education (Correspondence Course.)

Provided that he or she shall have passed the examination for the Bachelor of Education Degree in the first or Second Division both in Theory and Practical. (It can be relaxed in case of Teachers with Teaching Experience of 5 years or more.)

2/ For admission to the Examination of M.Ed.(C.C.), Part-I a candidate shall apply to the Registrar of the - University on a prescribed form through the Head of Department of Correspondence Courses and produce the Certificate of having attended the prescribed contact programmes of one week (to be organised in October/November) and five weeks (to be organised in May/June) durations organised by the department.

The University Examination of M.Ed.(C.C.)Part-I shall be conducted in the Month of July.

3/ For admission to the examination of M.Ed.(C.C.) Part-II a candidate shall apply to the Registrar of the University on a prescribed form through the Head, Department of Correspondence Courses and produce the following -
Certificates : -

- (i) Certificate of having passed M.Ed.(CC)Part-I Exam.
- (ii) Certificate of having completed sessional and Practical work.
- (iii) Certificate of having completed Dissertation work satisfactorily from the approved Supervisor by the Head, Department of Correspondence Courses.

The University Examination for M. Ed. (CC) Part-II shall be conducted in February/March or as may be fixed by the University.

- 4/ Candidate shall write a dissertation bearing on any aspect of his study embodying either-
- (i) the results of his original research and a critical presentation of existing data.
 - (ii) A Viva-Voce examination shall be held on dissertation and sessional and practical work.
 - (iii) Candidate shall submit the sessional work connected with the 5 theory papers during the contact programme organised during summer vacation and practical records at the time of Viva-Voce examination.
- 5/ For part-II examination of the candidates, the following scheme will be adopted-
- (i) Dissertation work-
 - (a) Evaluated by the Internal Examiner (generally he shall be Supervisor)
 - (b) External Examiner to be appointed by the University.
 - (ii) Sessional work connected with 5 Theory Papers-
Internal Examiner will be concerned Professor, who have taught content of the paper during contact programmes organised during May/June.
 - (iii) Viva-Voce Examination
Internal Examiner will be coordinator of the contact programmes or any Professor appointed by the University.
- 6/ In order to be successful in the examination, a candidate shall pass in both the parts by obtaining not less than 33% of the aggregate marks obtainable in Part-I, but not less than 25% Marks in any individual paper and not less than 50% of aggregate marks obtainable in Part-II.
